

Laura: I see. Anyway, can you tell me how to make the curry? I love cooking.

Raj: Well first, you need onions. Cut them up and cook them for a long time, then just add spices*, tomatoes, and meat or fish. It's very easy.

Laura: I see. Thank you, Raj. Why don't you come to my house next Friday? I'll make curry and you can tell me how it tastes.
