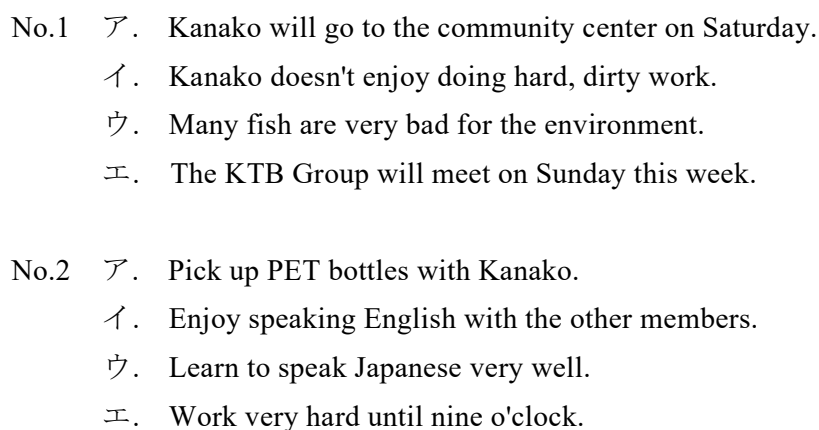

- Josh: Hi, Yumi. According to an article I read, *conversations in Japan are different from *Western-style conversations. I understood the article because I connected it to my own experiences.
- Yumi: Well, what do you mean? Tell me about it.
- Josh: When I came to Japan as an exchange student, I went to many parties. People enjoyed talking until I began to speak. After I joined in, they became quiet, and the conversations often stopped. I've had such experiences several times.
- Yumi: Maybe, it's because of the difference in languages, isn't it?
- Josh: Yes, but that's not the only difference. Usually, the Western-style conversation between two people is like a game of (①). If I talk about one idea — a ball in the game — I want the other person to hit it back. If he or she agrees with me, it's all right. If he or she does not agree with me, it is also quite all right. Anyway, I want him or her to return the ball to me.
- Yumi: I see your point. I stayed in the U.S. a few years ago, and I was surprised at first when two of my American friends enjoyed hitting the same ball to each other for a long time.
- Josh: If there are three or more people in the conversation, it is like (②). The nearest or quickest person hits the ball. Everyone tries to receive or hit the ball, but no one can hold it for a long time.
- Yumi: I don't think a Japanese-style conversation is like that.
- Josh: You're right. Usually, it's just like (③). You wait for your turn. When your turn comes, you walk up to the starting line with a ball and carefully throw it. Everyone else stands back and watches. After everyone realizes your turn is finished, the next person walks up to the same line with another ball.
- Yumi: I agree with that. I think it's important for us not only to learn foreign languages, but also to respect their conversational style.
- Josh: At first I was a little shocked. But now I think I've found some good points in both Japanese-style conversations and Western-style conversations.
- Yumi: I'm glad to hear that.

【状況】

あなたは地域の避難訓練で、英語ボランティアとして参加し、外国にルーツがある住民と訓練に参加しています。

- ① 消火器 (a fire extinguisher) をこれまでに使ったことがあるかどうかをたずねる。
- ② 大地震発生時 (When there is a big earthquake,) どこで英語の情報を見つけるべきかを知っているかたずねる。
- ③ みんながお互いを助け合うことは大切であると述べる。

These days, many plastic umbrellas are sold in Japan. They are very popular because they are convenient and cheap. We can buy them at nearby shops such as convenience stores, station kiosks, and 100-yen shops. If we get caught in the rain without an umbrella, we can easily buy a plastic one. Some people keep several plastic umbrellas at school, the office, or at home. You might be one of ①them, too.

Plastic umbrellas are useful, but they are causing serious environmental problems. Have you ever thought about how they affect the environment?

Plastic umbrellas produce a large amount of (A). There are several reasons for this. First, plastic umbrellas are often considered “disposable,” and are thrown away soon after use. Many of them are left on trains and buses, or in taxis. Second, they cannot be fixed or recycled. They are not very strong and break easily, especially in heavy rain. When they are broken, it is very difficult to take them apart and *separate them into different parts. This is because each part is glued together. They cannot be burned in *incinerators, so they are thrown away in *landfills.

Let’s think more about ②these problems. When we throw away plastic umbrellas, they end up in landfills. Over time, the plastic from the umbrellas breaks down into small pieces. These small pieces of plastic can be dangerous. Animals might eat the small plastic pieces by mistake, which can make them very sick. In addition, the plastic can get into the ground and water, which is bad for the planet.

So, what can we do to reduce waste from plastic umbrellas? Do you have any ideas? One way is (B). If there is a chance of rain, we can carry a folding umbrella in our bags. Folding umbrellas are usually stronger and last longer than plastic ones. Another idea is to use umbrellas made from eco-friendly materials. These umbrellas are better for the environment because they can be recycled.

We should be aware of the problems that plastic umbrellas cause. Let’s think carefully before buying another plastic umbrella. Maybe we can choose a stronger and more eco-friendly option. By making small changes, we can help protect the environment. Let’s work together to reduce the waste from plastic umbrellas and keep our (C) clean and healthy.
